SCHOOL AND INDUSTRY INFORMATION

COMPLETION, PASS/FAIL AND PLACEMENT RATES FOR 2009 (this is based on the students scheduled to graduate in 2009 and does not include students that graduated in 2010):

During 2009 127 students were scheduled to graduate from Inner State Beauty. A total of 87 graduated during the 2009 academic year. Some of the balance graduated in 2010. 90 graduates tested during 2009. 81 students passed their entire test including the appropriate management portion. 68 out of 80 eligible licensees found jobs within the industry.

COMPENSATION: Licensing in the field of cosmetology will open up many possibilities. A person may work in a salon and receive a base salary plus tips. A person may work and receive a base salary plus commission on all services performed and products sold. A person may rent space in a salon as a booth renter or independent contractor. This means you are running your own business within a salon. To rent space a person must have a manager licensed. Income will vary according to the salon you are in, hours you work and your clientele. Pay can be either hourly or salary. The average salary for a cosmetologist is about \$34,000 and can be over \$100,000 for a stylist with a large clientele.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS: Cosmetologists and Estheticians have long hours of standing with good posture. Nail Technicians must sit for long periods of time. This field requires a person to deal with a wide variety of personalities. All professionals must be able to communicate with their clients and deal effectively with the public.

SAFETY REQUIREMENTS: A person who works in the field of Cosmetology should be aware of the chemicals used for perms, color and nails whether you are breathing the chemicals or they get on your skin. Be aware of customers that might have a scalp disease or allergy to chemicals used.

LICENSING AND GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS: All hours required for the course(s) enrolled must be completed. The student must maintain a cumulative grade average of at least 75% and complete all tests, projects and assignments. All amounts owed to the school must be paid in full. Every student must take the Ohio State Board Examination to become licensed in the state of Ohio. Each student is responsible for their own State Board Registration and Exam Board fees.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

In order to be admitted into any course at Inner State the applicant must: **A).** Be at least sixteen (16) years of age with a government issued picture I.D. Students under 18 must have parents signature. **B).** Before you have a high school diploma or an equivalent. Equivalents include a GED or the student may provide a copy of their high school transcripts and pass an Ability To Benefit test. **C).** This is a physical and customer service oriented field. Each student must have the ability to deal with a wide variety of personalities and to meet the physical demands of their chosen career path.

SATISFACTORY PROGRESS POLICY

Satisfactory progress in attendance and academic work is a requirement for all students enrolled in this school. NOTE: Students receiving funds under any Federal Title IV financial aid program must maintain satisfactory progress in order to continue eligibility for such funds. Course incompletes or repetitions do not have an effect on satisfactory progress at this school

ACADEMIC and ATTENDANCE PROGRESS: A student must have achieved a cumulative grade of at least 75% based on the score of their theory work (test grades, homework, etc.) and practical/ clinical work. Students will be judged on the following scale: Excellent 93%- 100% (A), Good 85%- 92.99% (B), Average 75%- 84.99% (C), Below 75% Failing (F). Students must maintain at least a 67% cumulative attendance average in order to be considered making satisfactory progress and complete the program within the maximum time frame.

DETERMINATION OF PROGRESS: Evaluation of progress will be conducted on a quarterly basis. All students will be evaluated as of the first business day after January 1st, April 1st, July 1st and October 1st for cosmetology and esthetician students. The Manicuring students will be evaluated at the midpoint and end of training. Students with a cumulative average of at least 75% grade point average and a cumulative average of at least 67% attendance rate will be considered to be making satisfactory progress. Any student not meeting the minimum requirements for academic or attendance progress will be considered to be making unsatisfactory progress and will be placed on probation.

PROBATION: Students not making satisfactory progress will be placed on probation until the next evaluation period. During the probationary period, the student is still eligible for financial aid but must achieve an overall minimum passing grade of 75% or better and be in attendance 67% or more in order to re-establish satisfactory status. Two consecutive probationary periods may result in dismissal from school.

APPEAL PROCESS: Any student placed on probation or dismissed from school for failure to meet the satisfactory progress standards due to mitigating circumstances may submit a written appeal describing the circumstances to the School Director. The School Director will notify the student within thirty (30) days of acceptance or rejection of the appeal.
